

Ricky Punzalan is Assistant Professor of Archives and Digital Curation at the College of Information Studies (iSchool), Affiliate Assistant Professor in the Department of Anthropology, and Co-Director of the Museum Scholarship and Material Culture program at the University of Maryland, College Park. His research focuses on anthropological archives and the digitization of ethnographic records in historical collections. He has been a research associate at the Smithsonian's National Anthropological Archives since 2014 and currently Chair of the Native American Archives Section of the Society of American Archivists.

They will also demonstrate easy ways to leverage the power of LOD for archival organizations and their digital collections, with concrete examples involving WikiData, Omeka S, and the SNAC (Social Networks and Archival Context) Project.




